## FEBRUARY LUNCHEON-SCOTT PALOMINO

Scott is the 301st Fighter Wing Director of the Airman & Family Readiness Center at NAS JRB Fort Worth. He served in the USAF as a Command and Control Battle Management Operator assigned to the 603rd Air Control Squadron at Aviano Air Base, Italy. While deployed to Balad Air Base Iraq, Scott helped save the lives of four Airmen and two Army soldiers after an aircraft emergency and crash. He was awarded an Air Force Commendation Medal for his heroism. On 10 April 2004, he was injured in a mortar attack. He lost his left leg, below the knee in the attack. He was the first Airman amputee from the OIF campaign. Sadly, he also lost a fellow Airman. Scott received a Purple Heart from the Chief of Staff, Gen John P. Jumper and the Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force, Gerald R. Murray.



Scott was on the USAF Wounded Warrior Wheelchair Basketball, Sitting Volleyball, and Track & Field Team in 2013 & 2014. He was the 2014 USA Team Captain for the Invictus Games in London, England and the USAF Team Captain for the 2014 Olympic Wounded Warrior Games in Colorado Springs, CO. He earned numerous silver medals in these events.



Scott has made it his goal and mission in life to work with and mentor other Wounded Warriors and veterans.

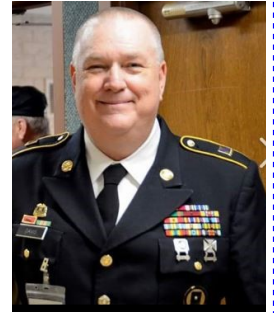


# BOARD MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

## ROY DAVIS

Sergeant First Class (ret) Roy F. Davis Roy attended his first luncheon in Feb 2017 and has loved it ever since. Two months later he joined the Roll Call Board as the military liaison. His love of history and all things military drove him to serve initially but it's his true love for our heroes that keeps him serving!

Roy served in the United States Navy from 1980 to 1987. He served aboard the USS Carl Vinson CVN-70 as an Aerographer Mate (Meteorology) commissioning her in 1982 and then made the maiden voyage "Around the World" in 1983 from Norfolk, VA to San Francisco, CA. After a short 2 year break, Roy enlisted in the USN once again. He was assigned to the Naval Oceanography Command Center/Joint Typhoon Warning Center in Guam. His command tracked typhoons in an area of responsibility encompassing 11 million square miles. In 1996, after another six years in the military, he decided to depart a second time.



In 2005, Davis moved to Fort Worth and once again enlisted in the military but this time in the United States Army Reserve. After training at Fort Knox, he reported to Co A 980th Engineer Battalion, then to the 721st Engineer Co. After those two assignments, he transferred to the 90th Aviation Support Battalion, then to the 370th Chemical Company, and finally back to the 90th Aviation Support Battalion, where he held Chemical, Fuels and Water MOS. Davis was a Platoon Sergeant for Headquarters Company. For his full-time job, Roy is a Conductor for BNSF Railway. He married to OK Chung Davis.
