SFC(R) Randy Nantz enlisted in the Army after 9/11/01, and after completing basic training at Fort Benning, GA, he reported to the 3rd Infantry Division located at Fort Stewart, GA. In January of 2003, he deployed to Kuwait to prepare for the Iraq invasion. After the initial phase of Iraq was over, he redeployed back home on August 25, 2003.

He then went to SFAS, Special Forces selection course in January of 2004 and successfully graduated as a Communications Sergeant in March

of 2006. SFC Nantz reported to the 5th Special Forces Group Airborne and deployed back to Iraq in August 2006.

On December 22 of 2006, while patrolling on a reconnaissance mission, Baghdad

Jadida, Baghdad, Iraq, an Explosively Formed Projectile (EFP), a devastating roadside bomb, struck the Humvee he was riding in. SFC Nantz sustained 22% Total Body Surface 3rd-degree burns, considerable

muscle tissue loss, and severe nerve damage, ultimately leading to a lower left leg amputation. To date, he has undergone four amputations on the same leg and around 20 other surgeries from the initial injury to now.

Today, Randy gives back to his community by working with the Adaptive Training Foundation to mentally and physical-

ly train other Veterans and Civilians alike with life-altering disabilities to regain living life again by showing them they too can #defy impossible.

Randy also has two beautiful kids, Ashley, 27, and Josh, 22.
